Letter from Our President

I recently visited with Jenny, a mom in our program, and her Together for Good (TFG) parent advocate, Maddy. Two years ago, God rescued Jenny from a life of addiction. With the support of TFG host families and Maddy, Jenny is successfully parenting her three-year-old son, Max. He is a happy boy, full of life! We are so proud of her.

"Jenny," Maddy shared, "God's sustaining love has carried you through some difficult times. We see you becoming the mother God created you to be. You are precious to Him. He will never leave you or forsake you. And we are here to walk with you. You are not alone." With tears in her eyes, she responded, "No one has ever told me I'm precious. Thank you."

I wish I could sit with you over a cup of coffee and share our 2024 Impact Report. It is full of numbers that represent lives – like Jenny's – who have been transformed by your sacrifice in serving and supporting TFG. Doing Good at Together for Good

Our goal is to keep families safely together through intentional relationships. These relationships are built in two primary ways: hostings and advocacy.

Emergency and Respite Hostings

During a hosting, trained volunteers open their homes to care for children. Often, when we first start hosting for a new participant family, the parent is in an immediate emergency. These crises calls come from a variety of referrals including, first responders, hospital staff, county social workers, treatment centers, prisons, or simply a desperate parent with no one to turn to. We are able to meet these families in some of their most difficult moments. As relationships are built with participant families, hostings move from *emergency* to *respite*. Respite hostings occur every 4-6 weeks and help establish reliable community for a previously isolated family.

Parent Advocacy

For a family to truly move out of crisis, the parent needs to know that they are not alone. TFG volunteer parent advocates are carefully matched by a TFG case manager to a one-on-one relationship with a participant parent. Each of these intentional friendships are unique; however, all involve regular check-ins, prayer, and the willingness to flexibly meet the needs of the participant parent.



261 families were served this year! More than 70% of families served stay connected with TFG.*

There were 1,531 hostings this year! That equals 3,667 days that children were in a safe home while their parents navigate crises.

2024 was a year of faithfulness.

At each of our sites, we saw our donors faithfully give, our staff and volunteers faithfully serve, and God faithfully transform lives.







In **Minnesota**, there were 145 more hostings than in 2023. This reflects hiring an additional case manager, a 33% increase in referral partners, and the unwavering readiness of our volunteers. Growth was also seen at our annual gala, which had more than 800 people in attendance!

In Iowa, we partnered with the Department of Health and Human Services as well as the Iowa State Director of Family Well-Being and Protection to help equip churches to serve in the child welfare space. We served over twice the number of families than the year prior – and today, nearly every participant family has an advocate.

In Texas, we hired two case managers – including a bilingual case manager. This has been a crucial first step to helping us better serve Spanish-speaking families in our communities. We had a 68% increase in the number of families we served as compared to 2023.

For a Good Future

2024 was the second year of implementing our five-year strategic plan that was formed in 2022. This plan was created to guide TFG as we meet the increasing demand of both families in need and Christians who want to be a part of Together for Good. Below are the six pillars of our plan and key accomplishments from 2024.

Known and Trusted

We launched a new website and increased our social media presence. We established a survey to measure TFG's ministry effectiveness in participant families' lives.

Volunteer Excellence

Over 100 volunteers attended Growing Deeper support groups in Minnesota and Iowa, receiving further education on topics related to TFG's work. We began testing a portal to improve volunteer on-boarding.

Employer of Choice

Across our Minnesota, Texas, and National teams, we brought on five new employees (two full-time and three part-time). Our staff (and board) attended the 2024 Christian Alliance for Orphans conference, receiving continuing education and refreshment.

Grow Our Reach

We met our fundraising goal to launch a TFG site in Wisconsin and started actively looking for a Site Lead. We hired a Vice President of Strategic Growth and created a formal site vetting process to prepare for expansion in the future.

Develop a Board of Champions

We welcomed a new board member, and our board has increased their engagement in TFG activities.

Financially Strong

We had a significant increase in our total donors. Additionally, our National/Minnesota gala was the largest ever with over 800 people in attendance.

Mobilizing the Church

In Iowa, three churches wrapped around a mom, Shakerra, who was homeless after leaving a domestic violence situation. Host families from each church took in her four kids, caring for them until she found a home. Support volunteers then furnished her apartment, brought meals, and built relationships with Shakerra and her kids.

There are currently over 1,000 TFG volunteers serving in various ways across the nation and many more host families and parent advocates are in the process of becoming fully approved to serve.

This is a nearly 15% increase from 2023. We had steady growth across each of our sites and are so grateful for the ministry coordinators who are serving as liasions between their churches and TFG.

Loving Our Neighbor

When Todd and Sarah Salava first began hosting Veronica's daughters, they never anticipated the friendship that would be built.

Veronica called Together for Good for respite care. She was working full-time, living out of her car, and overwhelmed as she cared for her two and one-year-old daughters, Promise and Aurora.

Shortly after being connected with the Salavas, Veronica found out she was expecting and – due to severe morning sickness that made her unable to work consistently – she lost her job.

When the Salavas heard about Veronica's increased hardship, they began hosting Promise and Aurora more often. They would care for the girls when Veronica was incredibly sick or needed time to search for a new job.

Through this extra care, Sarah and Veronica grew closer. Sarah said, "Being with her at such a vulnerable yet special time brought us closer together. Looking back, I think God put us in each other's lives months earlier so we could establish that trust, and she would have someone to lean on when she needed it."

Veronica welcomed a beautiful baby boy while Promise and Aurora were with the Salavas. After giving birth, Veronica experienced postpartum complications. However, thanks to the Salavas and to Veronica's other TFG host family and case manager, she was never alone.

As Veronica's health improved, her friendship with Sarah deepened. Veronica told Sarah, "I am overwhelmed with gratitude, I genuinely cannot thank you enough – I literally tear up! I'm praying one day I get to bless a young mom and give her everything you have given me and my kids! I love you and your family!"

Sarah and Veronica's friendship is a beautiful example of the relationships being built through TFG. When families come to us without support and community, every crisis they face is overwhelming. However, when a participant mom has a host family or advocate alongside her, even challenging crises become more manageable.

Sarah shared, "Our hope for Veronica is for her to always remember she's a child of God who is loved and worthy of love and connection – that there are good people in the world who genuinely want to help and be a part of her life." Sarah added she hopes Veronica will continue to be a part of the Salava's life for years to come.



The Families We Serve

- 99% are single moms facing poverty
- 50% were in the foster care
- 30% have unstable housing
- 25% are survivors of sex trafficking
- Many are battling addiction, mental health struggles, or medical crises
- Many have experienced domestic violence

*These numbers are from families willing to share – the actual number may be higher. The majority of families experience a combination of the above.

Looking Ahead to 2025

Reaching More Communities

We will significantly increase the number of people exposed to our unique model of care in order to deepen our impact. Our goal is to see more families and children served in each of our current locations and beyond. We continue to prayerfully consider new requests to bring the TFG model to other cities.

Deepening Connections with Churches

Churches are the backbone of our work. This next year, we will be working to increase the number of our church partners in order to meet the growing needs of our communities. We also want to deepen our connections with current churches through intentional communication, visits from our staff, and greater opportunity to serve.

Improving Volunteer Experience

Our volunteers are incredibly generous with their time and resources. We want to honor them by providing seamless support throughout their journey with TFG. To ensure a smooth and engaging on-boarding experience, we will be launching a new volunteer portal.

Become a Host Family

Host families welcome children into their homes for a few days or several months. They share the love of Christ through their actions and words, drawing young hearts to the Gospel.

Become a Parent Advocate

Parent advocates offer friendship to our participant parents, providing a listening ear and helping to meet practical needs.

Support volunteers serve both participants and host families. They work within their church to make meals, offer home organization, and to pray for all those serving.
